

**ACHIEVEMENTS/OUT PUTS OF
EDUCATION DEPARTMENT
FY 2022/2023**

The following activities were successfully done due the course of Financial Year 2022/2023, with the support from government.

- The salaries to all active teachers and other staff in support of Education department were fully paid and in time, this has led to improvement on service provision in the department.



- The released funds as non-wage helped the Education inspection team to do thorough inspection of both secondary and primary schools successfully in time scope which has improved in the standards of schools as per now.



- Also monitoring of all schools and other activities performed under Education department was fully done where even schools which destroyed by the storm were identified, report made and government released funds for renovation and now those schools are under construction.



- All government aided schools received their 100% UPE and USE and this has improved on the situations in schools. Therefore, all schools which received this capitation worked according to their budgets in time.



- During the course of last financial year 2022/23, under development, the department is managing the construction of Kyeera Primary School, Akabaare Primary Sch and Akatenga Primary Sch. As we speak, these schools Akatenga Primary School will be commissioned on 29th March 2023 while Akabaare and Kyeera are at 75% complete.





- Still under development, commissioning of Classroom blocks and staff quarters which were built by Army Brigade.

- Twin desks were procured and successfully delivered to schools which were badly off in furniture, this helped in improving the worse situation in classrooms.



- Generally, the funds released helped in facilitating the activities which help in smooth running the department at large.



- The department carried several activities such as induction training of PTA and SMC on their responsibilities and roles which was led by RDC,LCV C/P, DEO,CAO, and other department staff.



- There was Head teachers' retreat at L.Mburo which was successfully conducted with intention of inducting and retraining them on management skills



- Kiruhura DLG registered a great improvement in academic performance in PLE and UCE this year with 696 first grades as attached and ranked 39th in the whole country which is an indicator of hard working of the department

CHALLENGES:

Though the above outputs were achieved, the following challenges were faced and they need instant interventions for the betterment of the department.

- Most of the schools' infrastructure was Worsley hit by rain storms and this affects the smooth running of activities both at school and the department these schools affected include Kitura C.O.U Primary School and Mooya C.O.U Primary School.



- During inspection and monitoring, there was a lapse in time management due to poor road networks to coordinate schools. The government should put in consideration early rehabilitation of these community access roads not only for this activity but also for development of the country.



- There was also a challenge of limited means of transport since the department has only one vehicle. This is hard to segregate the roles of inspectors and DEO as per time table and in case of breakdown no work can be done at all. So we request that at least we are given a second vehicle to smoothly accelerate the work.



- Most of the schools need serious renovations and construction of new structures like latrines for both learners and staff, staff accommodation in order to be at standard level but the funds released for projects is not enough. So therefore development funds should be increased to at least cover 50% of schools per financial year.

- Both inspection and monitoring faces the challenge of limited facilitation to run the program perfectly. We therefore request the concerned ones to at least increase on the amount stipulated for these activities.

- Fluctuation of prices for the gearing materials like fuel, scholastics and others hinders the proper consideration of budget whereby you end up using more funds on an item than what was budgeted. I recommend that supplementing budget should be considered to cater for these changes.

- Caretaking of the Head teachers' position in most schools has become a challenge since the teachers caretaking cannot be fully liable on the responsibilities of the Head teacher. Therefore, we request that the responsible bodies should seek for the best solution of this challenge for the betterment of our schools.

- School ceiling also is a challenge mostly in schools with high enrollment, this make schools to employ private teachers on PTA arrangement who are expensive, this hinders the standards of performance since most of these teachers are not qualified. We request that the district to make a quick response on this matter.

- Clean water harvesting tanks are lacking in schools which hinders the primary hygiene since learners and staff share water source with animals. So therefore construction of tanks should be considered in development funds.
