

Cold or cough –no pneumonia has been the leading cause of morbidity(25.9%) and Malaria(15.4%) and the least being diabetes mellitus 0.8% and hypertension (1.4%)

INTERVENTIONS

- Continuous Quality Improvement at all level with system strengthening
- Functionalized the HCIV Kiruhura
- Health Financing with support from TASO, 7 microscopists were paid monthly salaries, and facilitated contact tracing and TB community outreaches
- Extended HAART centers to every HCIII in the District
- Solar installation done in 8 HCIIIS and still ongoing in other maternity wards
- Monitoring and Evaluation- Target setting to critical staff(clinicians and Laboratory), created whats'app platform for weekly reporting and monitoring, plotted and analysed monthly performance graphs at DHO's office
- Upgrading of six (6) HCII to HCIII status. Whereby five (5) were under Uganda inter-governmental Fiscal Transfer for Results (UGIFT) program and one (1) Rurambiira HC II was under Transitional Development grant. This enabled construction of Maternity homes. Four (4) were completed by close of last Financial Year, while 2 are in final stages, to be completed
- The 4 Completed and handed over Facilities (KITURA HC III, RURAMBIRA HCIII RWESHANDE HC III and NSHWERE HCIII)

INTERVENTIONS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

- Ongoing upgrade works for 2 Facilities:, RWABARATA & RWETAMU
- The District is operating a functional Maternity ward here at Kenshunga Epi-center
 Rwebigyemano- (Constructed by The Hunger Project-Uganda)- Completed and functional 4 years ago.
- The District Constructed a new Maternity ward at Nyakashashara using PHC devt. grant- and was completed
- The District also constructed an OPD ward at Kashongi HC3 and is functional
- When all the below maternity wards are complete, we shall have 13 out the 14 sub-counties/ town councils' with HC IIIS which will improve the coverage of sub counties with functional maternities to 92%
- The District in the last FY constructed staff houses as Rweshande and Kitura
- Construction of Drug/medical store at the district by UPDF
- The District has also managed to be the best in Ankole region in Quarter April –June 2022

challeges

- Lack of government hospital and poorly funded Kiruhura hciv
- Lack of staff accommodation for the staffs

PLANNED PROJECTS/INTERVENTIONS

THIS FINANCIAL YEAR 2022/2023

- Construction of Staff houses at Rwetamu and rwabarata-UGIFT
- Construction of staff house at Kiruhura HCIV (PHC)
- Fencing of Kiruhura HCIV with a gate to enhance security of staff, patients and goods.

Next Financial Year 2023/2024

- Construction of staff houses at Rurambiira HC3
- Completion and operationalization of Rwetamu and Rwabarata HC3s as well as equipping them.
- Construction of a 3 stance pit latrine at L.Mburo HC3.

DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSIONS

- The targeted interventions above have had a positive impact on the Health service delivery indicators of Kiruhura District as evidenced by improved immunization coverage 108%, improved OPD attendance, deliveries in our health facilities among others.
- We expect more improvements in the proportion of skilled attendance at birth in the District as more of the new Maternities wards become fully functional and a HCIV is established in Kashongi county
- The district and MoH should plan to create A health center in Akayanja subcounty to extend health care services in Akayanja subcounty
